




Unfortunately, due to illnesses, this month's VAVS Bingo had to be cancelled. But, on a positive note: Non-Covid! So, get well soon.

On the 27th, we received notice of another deep loss from our membership. Marine William (Billy) Maskal passed away. The sad news came from his family, who requested a family repast be held at our House. Rest in Peace, Bill.

William Maskal, 97, of East Rutherford for 60 years, passed away on January 27, 2022. Mr. Maskal proudly served in the US Marine Corps 6th Division during WWII. He served as a Gunner Corporal in an artillery crew on Okinawa, Japan in 1945 and in Tsingtao, China from 1945-1946. Prior to retiring, he was the proprietor and operator of a food concession stand in Passaic, retiring at the age of 65. William was a member of the Marine Corps League West Hudson Detachment in Kearny, the Rosol Dul American Legion Post 359 in Passaic and the V.F.W. Post 2640 in Wallington. Bill was a coin collector and an accomplished pool player. He enjoyed watching sports and was a fan of the NY Mets, Major League Baseball NY/SF Giants and NFL NY Giants. Beloved husband of the late Jean (nee Kacperowski) Maskal. Loving father of Ilona Maskal, John Maskal, Dr. Steven Maskal, Larry Maskal and his wife Janice and the late Richard Maskal. 

And, as a courtesy, the funeral home placed the flowers in front of our House, in remembrance. Truly an amazing gesture of kindness!


